WIND

- In February 2018, the total wind production was 8% below estimates.
- In particular, due to poor wind conditions, production generated in all our countries was lower than expected.
- Net wind production year-to-date is still fairly higher than budget (+4%) and the same period last year (+10%).

SOLAR

- **○** In February 2018, the total solar production was in line with estimates.
- In particular, the average irradiation was higher than expected in Spain, raising the solar production by +17% compared to estimates. In Italy, the solar production was slightly lower than expected (-5%) due to a lower average irradiation.
- Net solar production year-to-date is still fairly higher than expected (+5%) but lower than the same period last year (-5%).
